

- uhau.hau.** Redup. of *uhau*.
- uha'u.ha'u.** Same as *ha'uha'u*.
- uhau hili kini.pō.pō.** n. Batter (in baseball).
- uhau.hui.** nvt. Presentation of a prayer, especially in 'anā'anā sorcery; to present such a prayer.
- uhau.humu.** vt. To sew together, as sails; to lay together, as stones in a wall; to interlock. *Rare*.
- uha'ula.** vs. Lazy, good-for-nothing. *Rare*.
- uhau 'upena.** v. To strike with a net, as a bird-catching net on a long handle.
- uhē.** nv. Offering place for fish on a heiau; to offer, as fish. *Rare*.
- 'uhē.** vs. Chilly, wet and cold. *Ua uhi mai ka hau o nā kuahiwi; he manawa kēwai ia o ka mauna a me ka 'uhē* (Kep. 97), the dew of the hills settles down; it is a wet time in the mountains and uncomfortably cold.
- uhē'ē.** Plural of *he'e* 2-4.
- uhē.hēu.** vi. To fly or hurry as though on wings (*ēheu*). (Kep. 95.)
- 'uhēke.** vs. Plump, fat-cheeked, fleshy.
- 'ū.hēke.hēke.** Redup. of *'uheke*.
- uhelē.** 1. Plural of *hele*, to go. 2. *Rare* var. of *helehele*, to cut, skin, strip off bark or rind.
- uhē.lēhē.** vs. Sulky, annoyed, vexed. *Rare*.
- uhē.lēi.** Same as *helei*.
- uhemo.** Same as *hemo*.
- 'uhene.** nvt, interj. To play a merry tune, converse quietly and romantically, tease coquettishly; exclamation of exultation, as in songs; happy or joyous sound. Cf. *henehene*. *Ua 'uhene maila lākou i ka mele*, they played a merry tune. *'Uhene ahahana ka'u lei, na'u ia* (song), oh joy, oh boy; she's my darling.
- 'uhene.hene.** Same as *henehene*. **hō.'uhene.hene.** Same as *hō'ohenehene*.
- 'uhē.'uhē.** 1. Redup. of *'uhē*. 2. Interj. similar to *'uhi-'uhē*, ha ha!
- 'uhe'u.hene.** Redup. of *'uhene*; tra-la-la.
- uhē.ule.** vs. Weak, imbecilic, impotent (an epithet applied to men). *Rare*. Cf. *ule*, penis.
- uhi.** 1. nvt. Covering, cover, veil, film, lid, solid tattooing, tent (Puk. 26.12); to cover, spread over, engulf, conceal, overwhelm; to don, as a feather cloak. *Fig.*, to deceive, hide the truth. *Kākau uhi*, to tattoo solidly. *Uhi mai ka lani pō*, the night sky spreads forth [ignorance]. *Ua uhi 'ia kō lāua mau mana'o i ke aloha* (For. 4:67), their thoughts were overwhelmed with love. *Uhi i ka moe*, to make a bed. **hō'o.uhi.** Caus/sim. (PPN 'ufi.) 2. n. Large, bluish-brown birthmark. 3. n. The yam (*Dioscorea alata*), from southeast Asia, a climber with square stems, heart-shaped leaves, and large, edible, underground tubers. The plant is widely distributed through islands of the Pacific, where it is commonly grown for food. (HP 166-172, Neal 230.) Also *pālau*, *ulehihi*. In the past botanists have applied the name *uhi* incorrectly to the *hoi kuahiwi*. (PPN 'ufi.) 4. n. Mother-of-pearl bivalve, mother-of-pearl shank. (PPN 'ufi.) 5. n. Turtle shell piece used for scraping *olonā*. 6. n. Mark made by the gall of raw *pāpū 'awa* (a shellfish) on tapa or on the skin as an ornament. (PCP *u(f,s)j*.)
- uhia.** Pas/imp. of *uhi* 1. (PPN 'u(u)fia.)
- uhi 'ā.lēla.** n. A variety of yam, the tuber having white flesh and skin; grown in Puna, Hawai'i. (HP 168.)
- uhi 'ā.pana.** vt. To debate, argue. *Rare*.
- uhi 'ā.pana.** n. Patchwork cover or spread.
- uhi hō'o.noho.noho.** n. A variety of yam. See *-nohonoho*.
- uhi kala.koa.** n. A variety of yam, the tuber with mottled red and white flesh and white skin; grown at Hā'ena, Kaua'i. (HP 168.) Also *uhi 'ōni'oni'o*.
- uhi kē'o.kē'o.** n. A variety of yam, grown throughout the islands; tuber with white flesh and skin. (HP 168.)
- uhi.kino.** n. Body covering, garment, shield. *Pale kaua a me ka uhikino* (Hal. 35.2), shield and buckler.
- uhi laha.** See *laha* 3.
- uhi lehua.** n. A variety of yam, grown in Kona, Hawai'i, having a tuber with pinkish flesh, the vine stem with red wings. Perhaps the same as *uhi 'ula'ula* (HP 168.)
- uhi maka.** n. Veil, mask.
- uhi moe.** n. Bedspread.
- uhina.** n. Covering; throw or cast net.
- 'ū.hini.** 1. n. Long-horn grasshopper (Tettigoniidae); cricket (Grillidae); locust (Mat. 3.4). *'Ōhini pua*, young *'ūhini*, especially before wing development. 2. vs. Fine, weblike, tapering into a fine point; slender. 3. Short for *'uhinipili* 1-3. 4. n. Carob, an evergreen (*Ceratonia siliqua*). *Ni'ihau*.
- 'ū.hini 'ake.lika (akērida).** n. Grasshopper. (Oihk. 11.22.) (Gr. *akrida*.)
- 'ū.hini hulu.hulu.** n. Cankerworm. (Ioela 1.4.) *Lit.*, hairy grasshopper.
- 'ū.hini hulu 'ole.** n. Palmer worm, caterpillar. (Ioela 1.4.) *Lit.*, hairless grasshopper.
- uhi Ni'i.hau.** n. A variety of yam, the tuber with pink flesh; grown in Kona, Hawai'i (HP 168.)
- 'ū.hini lēlē.** n. Beetle, cricket. (Oihk. 11.22.) *Lit.*, flying grasshopper.
- 'ū.hini pa'a.wela.** n. An edible locust. *Lit.*, seared locust.
- 'uhini.pili.** 1. n. Same as *'unhipili*. 2. vs. Thin, tapering, feeble, weak. 3. vs. Flexed position in which Hawaiians were often buried.
- 'ū.hini pua.** n. Young *'ūhini* (locusts) as found on *'ilima* bushes; they were eaten.
- 'ū.hini wā.wāe hā.** n. Bald locust. (Oihk. 11.22.) *Lit.*, four-legged grasshopper.
- uhinu.** Same as *hinu*, *hinuhinu*.
- uhi 'ō.ni'o.ni'o.** Same as *uhi kalakoa*.
- uhi.pa'a.** n. Mother-of-pearl hook that might be used at any time of day. *Lit.*, solid cover.
- uhi pā.kau.kau.** n. Tablecloth.
- uhi pela.** n. Bed sheet, mattress cover.
- uhi poni.** n. A variety of yam, the tuber with red skin and red and white flesh; grown on the island of Hawai'i. (HP 169.)
- uhi.pū.** n. Apoplexy. *Rare*.
- uhi pū.ku'i.** n. Hub cap.
- uhi 'uala.** n. A variety of yam, the tuber like a sweet potato; grown on the island of Hawai'i. (HP 169.)
- 'ūhī.'ūhī.** vi. Sonorous puffing and blowing sounds, as accompanying the surging of volcanic fires; to puff or blow thus; shish-shish. See ex., *nome*.
- uhi.uhi.** 1. Redup. of *uhi* 1. (PPN 'ufi'ufi.) 2. n. An endemic legume (*Mezoneuron kauaiense*), a tree with pink or red flowers and thin, broad, winged pods (Neal 435). The wood is hard and heavy and formerly was used for *hōlua* (sleds), spears, digging sticks, and house construction. Also *kawa'ū*, *kea*, *kolomona*, and the weedy herb *Phaseolus lathyroides* (*Niihau*). **hō'o.uhi.-uhi.** To prepare *uhiuhi* wood for house posts (GP 8).
- 'ūhī.'ūhī.** nvi. Whine, as of a child; to whine.
- uhi 'ula, uhi 'ula'ula.** n. A yam, probably the same as *uhi lehua*.
- uhi.wai.** n. 1. Heavy fog, mist. *Lit.*, water covering. *Nae iki 'Iao i ka uhiwai*, [Mount] 'Iao is barely breathing in the heavy mist [one in dire distress]. 2. Type of tapa.
- uhō.hō'i.** Plural of *hōhō'i*.
- uhō'i.** Plural of *hō'i*, to leave.
- 'uhola.** Same as *hola*, to unfold, spread. *Fig.*, receptive and open, as the mind. Cf. *ma'i uhola*.
- uhole.** Plural of *hole*; to strip, as tough skin of fish such as *manini*, *humuhumu*.
- uholo.** Plural of *holo*, to run. *'O ka uholo ihola nō ia ā nalowale loa*, they hurried off and disappeared.
- uhoni.** Plural of *honi*.
- uhu.** 1. n. The parrot fishes, of which *Scarus perspicillatus* is among the most abundant and largest; *uhu* are plant eaters, the teeth are strong and beaklike, well fitted for clipping off food from coral. The name may be qualified by the terms *a'a*, *'āhiuhiu*, *'ahu 'ula* or *'ula*, *'ele'ele*, *halahala*, *kuwalakai* or *pāluka'luka*, *lā uli*, *pānoa*, *piko 'ula*, and *uliuli*.
