

- uku maka.hiki.** n. Annual payment or salary, annuity.
- uku makana.** n. Tip; gift payment, bonus.
- uku male (mare).** n. Dowry; marriage fee, as to the minister. *Lit.*, marriage payment.
- uku manawa.** nvi. Installment payment; to pay on time.
- uku moku.** n. Steamship fare.
- uku.pa'a.** Same as *ukupau*.
- uku palu.** n. A variety of *uku*, a fish. *Lit.*, soft *uku*.
- uku pa.na'i.** nvt. Refund, redemption, ransom, reward; to redeem, refund.
- uku pane'e.** Same as *uku ho'opane'e*.
- 'uku papa.** n. Crab louse (*Phthirus pubis*). *Lit.*, surface louse.
- uku.pau.** nvt. Piece labor, pay by the job rather than according to time, as on sugar plantations; used in pidgin for any work that everyone should pitch in gladly to finish; contract labor. *Lit.*, finished pay.
- 'uku pepa.** n. Book louse (*Atropus divinatoria*). *Lit.*, paper louse.
- uku poho.** nvt. Damages; to pay damages.
- 'uku po'o.** n. Head louse (*Pediculus humanus capitus*).
- 'uku pua'a.** n. Pig louse (*Haematopinus suis*).
- 'uku.'uku.** Same as *'u'uku*.
- uku.wai.** n. 1. Place in the grass house where host and guests visited, between the sleeping place and the door. 2. Name for that portion of a canoe between forward and after outrigger booms.
- ula.** 1. n. Spiny lobster (*Panulirus marginatus* and *P. penicillatus*). Varieties are qualified by the terms *hiwa*, *koa'e*, and *poni*. (PPN *'ura*.) 2. nvi. A flame; to flame, blaze.
- 'ula.** 1. nvi. Red, scarlet; brown, as skin of Hawaiians; to appear red. *Pi'i ka 'ula*, to blush, flush. *A 'ula! 'Ula ka maka!* Red! Red-eyed! [a rude remark, often said while drawing down an eyelid, a way of wishing ill luck]. Cf. *'ula'ula. hō.'ula*. To redden, make red. (PPN *kula*.) 2. n. Short for *koa'e 'ula*, red-tailed tropic bird. 3. nvs. Sacred; sacredness; regal, royal (probably so called because red was a sacred color). Cf. *'aha 'ula, 'ulāleo. Ka makani 'ula*, the sacred spirit. 4. n. Blood. *He 'ula waiwai*, blood of great value, as royal blood. 5. n. Agate. (Puk. 30.12.) 6. Same as *'ula 'ai hāwane*. 7. n. A ringing in the ears, as due to rising in altitude, believed by some to be a sign that one is being talked of. *Ke kani mai nei ka 'ula o ko'u pepeiao*, [I] hear my ear ringing. 8. n. Ghost, spirit. Cf. *'ulāleo. Kapua'i-ka-'ula* (O'ahu place name), footprint [of] spirits.
- 'ula'a.** Var. of *hula'a, kula'a. He hina nō ka 'a'ali'i kū makani, he 'ula'a pū me ka lepo*, the wind-resisting 'a'ali'i falls, [but] is uprooted together with the dirt [said of a strong warrior].
- ula ahi.** n. Fire flames.
- 'ulaa.hiwa.** Same as *'ula hiwa*.
- 'ula-'ai-hā.wanō.** n. A small red Hawaiian honey creeper, with black crown, wings and tail and gray neck (*Ciridops anna*), formerly endemic to the island of Hawai'i, probably now extinct. *Lit.*, red bird eating *hāwane* fruit.
- 'ula ali'i.** n. Chiefly blood.
- 'ulāe.** n. Lizard fishes of the family Synodontidae, *Synodus* spp., *Saurida gracilis*, common reef fishes. Varieties are qualified by the terms *niho 'ā, 'ula*, and *uli*.
- 'ula.hōa.** vs. Faded red.
- ulā.hōo.** To appear and disappear quickly, as steam. *Rare*.
- 'ula hiwa.** nvs. Purplish red, dark red, as of a Rhode Island Red chicken; a red cock; formerly, a black cock with red neck feathers and red rump feathers. See ex., *uakea* 2.
- ulaia.** Same as *'alala*.
- 'Ula-ka-maka-iā-Kui.kui-pahu.** n. A stroke in *lua* fighting. Cf. *'ula* 1.
- 'ula kī.na'u.** nvs. Red streaked or dotted with dark, said of red feathers and a type of red feather cloak; to be such.
- ulako.lako.** Plural of *lakolako*.
- 'ū.lala.** vs. Crazy, mad, demented, harmlessly deranged, silly. **ho'ū.lala.** To behave as one crazy; to cause craziness.
- 'ula lōle.** n. Disembodied spirit. *Fig.*, esteemed favorite.
- 'Ula-lēna.** n. A reddish-hued rain associated with Ha'ikū, Maui, and Mt. Ka'ala, O'ahu. Also a wind at Pi'iholo, Maui (Nak. 68). *Kapu ka luna o Ka'ala i ka ua 'Ula-lēna* (chant), the uplands of Ka'ala mountain are sacred with the red-yellow rain.
- 'ula lēna.** nvs. Yellowish-red.
- 'ū.lā.lēo.** n. An intense emotional appeal to the gods, as in chant; a voice from the spirits. *Eia nō ka 'ula lā, he 'ulāleo, he kānaēnae aloha iā'oe, ē Laka* (chant), here is a sacred thing, a calling appeal, a chant of affection for you, O Laka. See *inoa 'ulāleo*.
- 'ulā.li'i.** n. 1. Measles; red spots of measles. 2. Dotted swiss or other cloth with red spots; red spots.
- 'ula mā.ku'e.** nvs. Dark or purplish red.
- ulana.** 1. vt. To plait, weave, knit, braid; plaiting, weaving. Also *unala, nala, unana. Mea ulana 'ia*, plaited or woven material, textile. *Mea ulana lōle*, weaver (Isa. 38.12), loom. (PPN *langa*.) 2. vs. Still, calm. Cf. *lana* 1. 3. nvt. Prophecy of a seer (*kilokilo*); to prophesy.
- 'ula.'ō.koko.** vs. Blood-red.
- 'ula.pa'a.** n. A girl of preadolescent age prior to the time of menstruation. *Lit.*, held redness. Cf. *pu'upa'a*.
- 'ula palani.** vs. A bright-red percale; a vivid red, brandy red.
- ula pā.papa.** n. A gray crayfish (*Parribacus antarcticus*). *Lit.*, flat *ula*.
- 'ula.'ula.** 1. Redup. of *'ula* 1; bay, as a horse. *'Ula'ula o ke ahi*, the red of fire; *fig.*, a flush of intoxication, newly distilled liquor. *'Ili 'ula'ula a na'au 'ula'ula*, venom-tongued and heart filled with hate. **hō.'ula.'ula.** To redden, make red. *Mea hō'ula'ula lehelehe*, lipstick. *Mea hō'ula'ula papālina*, rouge. (PPN *kulakula*.) 2. n. Various red snappers of the family Lutjanidae as *Etelis marshi*. Varieties are qualified by the terms *hiwa, koa'e* (tropic bird, perhaps named because of the long streamer on the fish's tail thought to resemble the bird), *maoli, 'ōpūlauoho*. 3. n. A native variety of taro, with red or purple petioles, small leaf blades with purple *piko*, reddish flowers, the corms used for both poi and table taro, grown in wetland and upland culture. (Whitney 50-52.) *'Ula'ula* may be qualified by the terms *kumu, moano*, and *poni*. 4. The cardinal, Kentucky cardinal (*Cardinalis cardinalis*), established in about 1930. 5. n. Blood. 6. n. A red tapa. 7. n. A variety of sugar cane. (HP 222, 225.)
- 'ula'u.lā'a.** Redup. of *'ula'a*.
- 'ula.'ula hā.'ula, hā.'ula.'ula.** nvs. Dark red, formerly said of dark bay horses.
- 'ula.'ula.ila.** n. A child whose sire was a chief and whose mother a commoner. *Lit.*, birthmark red.
- 'ula'ula lehelehe.** See *'ula'ula* 1.
- 'ula'ula papālina.** See *'ula'ula* 1.
- ula.wai'a.** vt. To fish, of many persons or often.
- 'ula waina.** nvs. Wine-red.
- 'ula wēna.** nvs. A glowing red, as from fire.
- 'ula weo.** nvs. Dark-red.
- ule.** 1. n. Penis. For imaginative compounds see *'a'awa* 1, *'aweule, ulehala, ulehole, ulepa'a, ulepua'a, ule'ulu. Kū ka ule, he'e ka laho*, the penis is upright, the scrotum runs away [refers to breadfruit: when the blossom (*pōule*) appears erect, there will soon be fruit. (PPN *ule*.) 2. n. Tenon for a mortise; pointed end of a post which enters the crotch of a rafter (also called *ma'i kāne*). **ho'o.ule.** To form a tenon or post for the crotch of a rafter. 3. v. To hang.
- ule.hala.** n. Aerial pandanus roots. Also *uleule hala*.
- ulehō.** Same as *ulehelehe*.
- ulehe.lehe.** vs. Unbound, unfastened, not tied, as a bundle; open, as a wound.
- ule.hihī.** Same as *uhi*, yam. *Rare*.
- ule hilo.** n. Gonorrhoea.
- ule.hole.** n. Channel markers in a harbor.
- ule hole.** n. Pulled back penis (an insulting epithet for men).
