

- 'umeke 'ai. n. Poi bowl. *Fig.*, source of food, of the uplands.
- 'umeke ipu kai. n. Bowl, as for serving meat or salty meat.
- 'umeke kepa.kepa. n. Bowl with horizontal flat panels. *Lit.*, wedged bowl.
- 'umeke lā'au. n. Wooden bowl.
- 'umeke māna 'ai. n. Very small bowl, as formerly used for poi by favorite children. *Lit.*, poi mouth-fed bowl.
- 'umeke 'ō.paka. n. Bowl with vertical panels with vertical edges between them. See 'ōpaka 1.
- 'umeke pala.pa'a. n. Thick-bottomed wooden calabash. *Lit.*, firm-dabbed bowl, perhaps so called because dabs of poi are held firm in this type of calabash that does not upset.
- 'umeke pā.wehe. n. A decorated gourd bowl, as made on Ni'ihau.
- 'umeke pō.hue. n. Gourd calabash.
- 'ume launa. n. The attraction that draws two solids and makes them one.
- 'ume lau.oho. n. The attraction that draws liquids up through narrow tubes, capillary action; siphon. *Lit.*, hair attraction.
- 'ū.melu. vs. Somewhat decomposed, as fish. Cf. *melu*.
- 'ume mā.kō.neki (mageneti). n. The attraction or pull of a magnet.
- 'umēna. n. An attraction, pulling. See 'ume 1.
- 'ū.mēnē. Same as 'ūpepe.
- 'umē.'umē. Redup. of 'ume 1-3. (PCP *kumekume*, to pull.)
- 'umi. 1. vt. To strangle, choke, suffocate, stifle, throttle, smother, suppress; to repress, as desire. *E* 'umi i ka waimaka, hold back the tears. (PPN *komi*, PCP *kumi*.) 2. num. Ten, tenth (num. from 11 to 19 are listed below). (PPN *kumi*.)
- 'umia. Pas/imp. of 'umi 1. 'Umia ka hanu! (a war cry), hold the breath! Be patient, persist!
- 'umi.hau. n. Offering of pig between two armies before starting battle. (Malo 197.)
- 'ū.mī'i. nvt. Clamp, clip, clasp, staple, clutch, buckle, vise, trap; to pinch, clip, clasp, clamp, squeeze; sharp body pain, pang, or cramp, as in the side. Also 'umiki. *Makaaniani* 'ūmi'i, spectacles held on the nose with clips, and without supporting handles on the ears; pince-nez. *Mea ho'opa'a* 'ūmi'i, stapler. *Ka* 'ūmi'i 'ana i ka wāwae, binding of feet (as formerly of Chinese women).
- 'ū.mī'i 'iōle. n. Rattrap, mousetrap.
- 'umi'i.kō. n. Introduced sugar-cane leafhopper (*Perkinsiella saccharicida*).
- 'ū.mī'i kuapo. n. Belt buckle.
- 'ū.mī'i kukui haole. n. Nutcracker.
- 'ū.mī'i lau.oho. n. Hair clasp.
- 'ū.mī'i pepa. n. Paper clip, clamp, staple.
- 'umi kama.li'i. Same as 'umi keiki.
- 'umi keiki. nv. Infanticide; to strangle infants; foeticide.
- 'umiki. Same as 'ūmi'i. Cf. 'Ulu'oa. ho'ō.'umiki. Caus/sim.; to shape a gourd for a drum, as by tying.
- 'ū.miki.miki. Redup. of 'umiki; to crumble.
- 'umi kū.mā-. An element compounded with numbers from one to nine to indicate 11 to 19. See Gram. 10.3. Cf. 'umi kumamā.
- 'umi kū.mā.hā. num. Fourteen.
- 'umi kū.mā.hiku. num. Seventeen.
- 'umi kū.mā.iwa. num. Nineteen.
- 'umi kū.mā.kahi. num. Eleven.
- 'umi kū.mā.kolu. num. Thirteen.
- 'umi kū.mā.lima. num. Fifteen.
- 'umi kū.mā.lua. num. Twelve.
- 'umi kuma.mā-. Same as 'umi kūmā-. Numbers one to nine are suffixed to this also. *Biblical*.
- 'umi kū.mā.ono. num. Sixteen.
- 'umi kū.mā.walu. num. Eighteen.
- 'umina. n. Strangling, choking, etc. See 'umi 1. (PNP *kominga*.)
- 'umi.'umi. 1. n. Whiskers, beard, goatee, mustache; ten-
- dril; barbel or feelers on lower jaw of a fish; suckers that fasten bivalves such as the *nahawe* to rocks; rope used for hauling unfinished canoe hull from the forest to the shore. *Ē!* 'umi'umi kao! Say! Goat's beard! [a taunt of one child to another child who has been scolded, sometimes accompanied by goat-like bleating and tugging on an imaginary beard]. (PPN *kumikumi*.) 2. Redup. of 'umi 1. (Possibly PNP *kumikumi*, PCP *kumikumi*.)
- 'umi.'umi-o-Dole. Same as *hinahina* 2, Florida moss. *Lit.*, Dole's whiskers.
- 'umi.'umi pē.heu.heu. n. Sideburns.
- 'umi wai. v. To flush, of a toilet.
- umo. nvi. To moo, bellow; to bark, of seals; mooing.
- 'umoki. 1. nvt. Cork, stopper, plug, bung; to cork, stop up; wad of a gun; partitions in bamboo water containers; to shoot an arrow so that it hits a mark squarely. See *wili wehe* 'umoki. 2. vt. To plant taro shoots in small holes made by a stick. (Kep. 153.)
- 'umo'u.moki. Redup. of 'umoki 1, 2; to puff at a pipe or cigar, so called because of the movement of the cheeks.
- umu. n. Oven, furnace (Ezek. 22.20); a heap of rocks placed in the sea for small fish such as the *manini* to hide in: this was surrounded by a net and the fish were caught. More commonly called *imu*. ho'ō.umu. To make an *umu*; to pile in a heap. (PPN 'umu.)
- umu ahi. n. Fire pit. *Ka umu ahi e pūnohu ana* (Kin. 15.17), a smoking furnace.
- umu.akua. Same as *waiakua*, aloof.
- umu lepo. n. Earth oven.
- umu loa. Same as *imu loa*.
- 'ū.mu'ō. Var. of 'ōmu'ō, to nip.
- umu pao. Same as *imu pao*.
- una. 1. n. Shell of turtle or tortoise, carapace. (PPN *una*.) 2. Same as *haha kā* 'upena (net gauge or spacer) so called because some were made of turtle shell. 3. Var. of *une*. 4. n. Dice.
- una. ho'ō.una. To send, transmit, send on an errand, command, put to work; to mail; to send spirits on an errand, especially of destruction. See *hoa una*. *Ho'ouna na ka mokulele*, to send by air mail. (PPN *unga*.)
- unā. vs. Fatigued, weary (Lunk. 4.21). Cf. *nā* 1. ho'ō.-unā. To cause weariness.
- 'unaē. 1. n. The lumpy sea cucumber (*Stichopus chloronotes*). 2. vs. Worn thin and lumpy, as a mattress, or formerly, the dried leaves under the sleeping mat.
- unahe. 1. Same as *nahe*; light breeze. *Unahe ka pā o ka makani*, the wind blows gently. *Ho'olele lupe i ka unahe* (Kep. 115), fly kites in a light breeze. 2. A foliose lichen (*Parmelia perlata*).
- unahe.nahe. Same as *nahenahe*, soft.
- unahi. nvs, vt. Scales of a fish; scaly; to scale. (PNP 'unafi.)
- unahi kala.kala. n. Rough scales, especially from mid-body to tail of certain fishes; scute.
- unahi.nahi. Redup. of *unahi*; many scales.
- unahi.pī'i. vs. Cracked and peeling, of the soles or heels of the feet.
- unahi.pipi. n. Young *pipi* shellfish.
- unahi pō.haku. n. Lichen growths on stones. *Lit.*, stone scales.
- unahi.uhu. n. A variety of sweet potato.
- unala. Var. of *ulana* 1-3.
- unana. 1. Var. of *unala*, to plait. 2. vs. Wee, tiny. *Rare*. 3. n. A bird (no data). (KL line 321.) 4. n. A plain. *Rare*.
- una.'oa. Same as *kauna'oa*, a mollusk. (PPN 'ungakoa.)
- unaue. Plural of *naue*. See ex., *polikua*.
- una.una. n. Hermit crabs in general. Also *pāpa'i iwi pūpū*. (PPN 'unga.)
- unauna. ho'ō.una.una. Redup. of *ho'ouna*; sorcery. (PNP *ungaunga*.)
- unā.unā. Redup. of *unā*.
- unau.nahi. vt. To scale, of fish.
- unē. nv. Lever; lever on a sewing machine that raises or
