 'ū.palu.palu. **1.** Redup. of 'ūpalu **1.** **2.** nvt. According to Malo, a type of fishing; translated by Emerson as "ordinary angling." (Malo 210, 213.)
 'ū.pā makani. n. Bellows.
 'ū.pā mau'u. n. Grass shears.
 'ū.pā miki.'ao. n. Fingernail or manicure scissors.
 'ū.pā nui. n. Shears.
 'ū.pā 'oki niho.niho. n. Pinking shears. *Lit.*, shears for cutting points.
 'upā.palu. **1.** Same as 'ūpalupalu **1.** **2.** n. The larger cardinal fishes, *Apogon* spp., *Apogonichthys perdx*, *Foa brachygramma*. A var. name is 'upāpalu maka nui.
 'ū.pā 'umə. n. Nippers.
 'ū.pā 'ū.mi'i. n. Pliers.
 'upa.'upā. Redup. of 'upā; to rub clothes up and down a washboard.
 ū.pā. vs. Crushed, flattened; humble, bashful; dry and juiceless, as sugar cane. Cf. Gram. 6.3.3. *Hale maka upē*, humble-appearing house. ho'o.ū.pā. To crush, belittle, flatten, treat contemptuously (Kep. 107).
 'upe. **1.** Same as *io*, a rib on a paddle. **2.** n. Spear point. *Pa'a loa i loko o ka 'upe o ka ihe* (For. 4:469), firmly stuck within the spear point.
 'ū.pā. n. Mucus. *Fig.*, tears, grief. Also *hūpā*. *Kahe ka 'upē*, mucus flows. *He 'upē*, he waimaka, he waimaka aloha (PH 139), the nose runs from weeping, tears, tears of love. *Mai ho'omakamaka wahine*, he 'upē ka loa'a, don't make a pal of a woman, nose running in grief is the outcome. *Ē kēnā wahi keiki 'upē kole* (GP 24), O you little mucus-laden red [nosed] boy. (PPN *isupe'e*, PEP *supe'e*; PCP *supe*, *suupee*.)
 'ū.pēhu.pēhu. vs. Swollen, bloated; inflammation. Cf. *pehu 1*.
 'upena. n. Fishing net, net, web. *Fig.*, trap. (PPN *ku-penga*.)
 'upena ahu.ulu. n. Same as 'upena uluulu.
 'upena 'ā.ki'i.ki'i. n. Dip net. Cf. *lā 5*.
 'upena 'akuku. n. Net held open by supporting stick. Cf. *kuku*, *puhi*.
 'upena 'alihi. n. Name given for a net spread over a patient by a medical *kahuna* in order to catch evil spirits.
 'upena 'apo.'apo. n. Gill net.
 'upena-hā.lu'a. n. Tapa-beater design.
 'upena-hā.lu'a-niho-manō. n. Tapa-beater design, with stripes and shark-teeth motifs.
 'upena ho'o.hēi.hēi. n. A type of net or snare (no data).
 'upena ho'o.lēi. n. Throwing net.
 'upena ho'o.lewa.lewa. n. Gill net stretched at high tide across fish runs in shallow water. *Lit.*, suspended net.
 'upena ho'o.moē.moē. n. Set net.
 'upena hō.una. n. Net made of fibers of *hau* and 'ahu-*'awa*. *Lit.*, scoop net.
 'upena 'iao. n. Net for 'iao, bait fish.
 'upena kahe. n. Net similar to the *pāku'iku'i*. *Lit.*, flow net.
 'upena kā.hē'ē. n. Scoop or hand net. See *kāhe'e*.
 'upena kā.'ili. n. A type of net or seine (no data).
 'upena kā.kā uhu. See *kākā 4*.
 'upena kā.wa'a. n. Net about forty fathoms long used in deep-sea fishing with canoes.
 'upena kiloi. n. Throwing net.
 'upena kiola. n. Throwing net.
 'upena kō lau. n. Seine. Also *hukilau*. *Lit.*, rope-pulling net.
 'upena kolo. n. Immense bag net said to be from sixteen to twenty-four fathoms deep. *Lit.*, towing net.
 'upena ku'u. n. Gill net, set net.
 'upena lau.oho. n. Hair net.
 'upena lu'u.lu'u. n. Small net, baited, weighted down, and set on the sea floor; fishermen dived (*lu'ulu'u*) to bring it up.
 'upena mā.'i'o. n. Net made of *hau* fiber. *Lit.*, jagged net.
 'upena mā.kini. n. A net used for destruction, as by robbers to snare victims.
 'upena mao.mao. n. A large net used in deep water with the *melomelo* lure. *Lit.*, far net.
 'upena mō.kū. n. Net that is baited and left in the sea, as for *pāpa'i*, crabs.
 'upena nana.nana. n. Spider web.
 'upena 'ō.hua palemo. n. Net used for young *palemo*, a fish. Also *nae*.
 'upena pā.ki'i.ki'i. n. Same as 'upena 'āki'iki'i.
 'upena papa. n. Bag net, said to be a combination of three nets, with the *puhi nui* at the opening (meshes two or more fingers in width), then the *puhi iki* (meshes half as large), and at the end the *pāpā*, which was also called the *mole*. *Lit.*, stratum net.
 'upena pā.pa'i. n. Net for catching *pāpa'i*, crabs. Also 'upena mōkū.
 'upena pili. n. Two nets attached to either side of the opening of the *pāku'iku'i*. *Lit.*, joining net.
 'upena po'o. n. Bag net. *Lit.*, head net.
 'upena pū.nā.wēle.wēle. Same as 'upena nananana.
 'upena-pupu. n. A tapa-beater design with net meshes enhanced with small circles.
 'upena uluulu. n. A scoop net with two parallel sticks for a frame. Probably *lit.*, frayed net. *Ka 'upena uluulu noho i ka hāpapa* (song), the uluulu net in the shallows.
 ū.pā.pā. Redup. of *upē*.
 'ū.pepe. vs. Flat-nosed. Also 'amene, *kāmene*.
 'upe.pēhu. Same as 'apehupehu.
 'ū.pī. nvt. Sponge; syringe, enema; to squirt, squeeze, spray through an orifice; to squish-squash, as the noise made by walking with shoes full of water; to extract by pressing and wringing; to express; to give an enema.
 upi'i. Plural of *pi'i*, to go up.
 'ū.piki. **1.** nvt. Trap, snare, clamp; treachery; to snap or clamp together, as a trap, the jaws, or a bivalve; to shut or close, as a flower; to pinch, as with pressure of thumb and fingers. Same as 'ōpiki. See *ex.*, *pahēle*. **2.** A tapa stamp.
 'ū.piki 'iolo. n. Rattrap, mousetrap.
 'ū.piki lima. n. Handcuff.
 'ū.piki.piki. Redup. of 'ūpiki **1**.
 'ū.pī laho. nv. Testicle squeezing, said of male homosexuality.
 'ū.pili. vs. Cramped, crowded, packed tight. Cf. 'ōpili. *Maka 'ūpili*, tightly closed eyes.
 'upī.'upī. Redup. of 'upī; to soften an octopus, as by holding the head and working the tentacles up and down in a container with salt.
 'ū.poho. **1.** nvi. Same as *poho*; the sound produced by clapping the body with cupped hands. Cf. *kai 'ūpoho*. **2.** n. Bagpipe.
 'ū.po'i. Same as *po'i 1-5*; to move, as a bird its wings. (Isa. 10.14.)
 'ū.po'i maka. n. Eyelid.
 'ū.po'i.po'i. Same as *po'ipo'i*. 'Ō'ili maila 'o 'Ai-ohi-kupua a ma ke alo o Ihu-anu kū ihola, a ua 'ūpo'ipo'i nā lima (For. 5:409), 'Ai-ohi-kupua appeared before Ihu-anu and stood there and slapped his cupped hands against his body [to resound defiantly].
 'ū.polu. vs. Moist. *Ka maka 'ūpolu o ka lehua i ka ua*, the soft petals of the *lehua* wet by the rain.
 'upu. nvt. Recurring thought, desire, attachment, hope, expectation; to desire, long for, covet, keep thinking of with anticipation. Cf. *hā'upu'upu*, *nahele*. *E 'upu a'e ka mana'o e 'ike i ka nani* (song), thinking and longing to see the beauty. 'A'ole nō i 'upu iho, komo mai ana ka mō'i wahine, in a moment, the queen entered [*lit.*, not indeed a thought given]. Cf. 'ū 2. (PPN *kupu*.)
 'ū.puku. Rare var. of *ʻpuka*.
 upu.pā. n. Sandpiper; lapwing (KJV), hoopoe (RSV) (Oihk. 11.19).
 'upu.'upu. Redup. of 'upu. 'A'ole i 'upu'upu, in hardly any time. hō.'upu.'upu. To recall to someone else, remind; to terrify someone by repeating an unpleasant impending event, especially that one is to be the victim of sorcery; to harp on impending doom. Cf. *hā'upu-*
