

- 'upu, to recall without this pejorative connotation. (PNP *kupukupu*.)
- 'u'u. nvt. To strip, as leaves or *maile* bark; to draw in, as a line on a ship; to draw out, unsheath, as a sword; to draw back, as the fist preparing to strike, or as the foot about to kick; to hoist, as a sail; to practice masturbation; to answer back sharply or rudely; to pour suddenly, as rain. 'U'u ke kuāua, down came the shower. 'O ka 'u'u maila nō ia i ka pākīkē, it was a snapping forth rudely. He po'e 'u'u maunu palu 'ala'ala no kekahi po'e lawai'a, a people who draw out the octopus ink sac bait preparation for other fishermen [those who do the dirty work from which others reap the benefit]. (PPN *kuku*.)
- 'ū. 1. Redup. of 'ū 1; to stutter, stammer. Ka 'ū'ū 'ana o nā mamo o 'Isera'ela (Puk. 6.5), the groaning of the children of Israel. (Possibly PPN *kuukuu*.) 2. Redup. of 'ū 2; impregnated partially, as fish with salt. (Ho-'oma'ū is used today for soaking.) 3. n. All soldierfishes of the genus *Myripristis*; some were considered 'aumākua. Ua loa'a akula ka i'a 'o ka 'ū'ū' the soldierfishes have (just) been caught [one has cause to sigh or grieve, a play on 'ū, to sigh]. 4. (Cap.) n. Star name (no data).
- 'ū. 'ua, 'ū'uwa. vs. Slippery, slimy.
- 'u'u. 'ina. Redup. of 'u'ina 1.
- 'u'uku. vs. Tiny, small; few. See 'uku. 'U'uku iho, undersized, smaller. ho'o. 'u'uku. To make small, reduce, lessen.
- 'u'ulu. haku. vs. Lumpy, bumpy, coarse, said of some skin diseases. Cf. 'uluhaku.
- 'u'ulu. kai. vs. Bloated, swollen, dropsical.
- 'u'umi. Redup. of 'umi 1, to strangle. See ex., auka. (PNP *kokomi*, PCP *kukumi*.)
- 'u'umuiku. Short, deficient, defective. (AP.)
- 'u'unu. Redup. of 'unu.
- 'u'u. peku. peku. vi. To sway, teeter, as the mast of a ship at sea.
- 'u'u'u. Redup. of 'u'u.
- 'ū. 'u'u. Same as 'ū'ū 1. Ka po'e 'ū'u'u (Isa. 32.4), the stammerers. Ua 'ū'u'u noho'i kona leo (Mar. 7.32), an impediment also in his speech.
- 'ū. 'uwa. Var. spelling of 'ū'ua.
- 'uwā. nvt. To shout, cry out, yell, sound loud, shout, racket. See wā, noise. 'Uwā ho'ohilahila, to hoot at, shout at in derision. ho'o. uwā. Caus/sim.
- 'uwa'a. vt. To dig or dredge a trench or furrow. Cf. wa'a, trench.
- uwahi. Var. spelling of uahi.
- uwai. Var. spelling of uai.
- ū wai. vs. Water-soaked, soggy.
- uwaki. Var. spelling of uaki.
- 'uwalā. Var. spelling of 'uala.
- uwali. Same as wali, soft, smooth. Cf. uwa'uwali.
- uwalo, ualo. nvt. To call out, as for help; to resound; a call. Cf. walo. Ke akua uwalo i ka la'i (chant), the god calling out in the calm.
- 'uwalu. Same as walu, to claw. 'Eha ka pōhaku i ka 'uwalu a ke ahi (PH 202), the stone suffers as it is clawed by the fire.
- uwā.ni'i. Var. spelling of uāni'i.
- 'uwao. Var. spelling of 'uao.
- uwapo. Var. spelling of uapo.
- uwa'u, ua'u. Same as wa'u, to grate.
- 'uwa'u. Var. spelling of 'ua'u, petrel.
- 'uwā. 'uwā. Redup. of 'uwā.
- uwau.wai. Var. spelling of uauai. See uai.
- uwa'u.wali. vs. Soft, limp, weak. Lilo kō lāua uāni'i i mea uwa'uwali wale nō, their stiffness will become just limpness.
- uwe. Var. spelling of ue.
- uwē. Var. spelling of uē.
- 'uwehe, 'uehe. 1. vt. To open, uncover, reveal, untie; to pry open, as a bivalve; to remove evil influence, as by prayer. Cf. wehe. 2. nvi. Hula step: one foot is lifted with weight shifting to opposite hip as the foot is lowered; both knees are then pushed forward by the quick raising of the heels, with continued swaying of the hips from side to side (a difficult step); to do this step.
- uwē.hēhē. Same as ehehē.
- uwēka, uēka. vs. Dirty, bleary, as the eyes. Cf. weka.
- 'uweke. Same as 'uwehe 1, 2. ho'o.uweke. Caus/sim.; to open a little.
- uwēko, uēko. vs. Bad-smelling, musty. Also weko.
- uwēko.wēko, uēkoēko. Redup. of uwēko.
- uwēne. Var. spelling of uene.
- uwēnewēne. Unclean in habits. (AP.)
- uwēpa. Var. spelling of uēpa 1-3.
- uwē.uwē. Var. spelling of uē.
- uwēu.wēko, uēuēko. Redup. of uwēko.
- 'uwē'u.wēle. Var. spelling of 'ue'uele.
- 'uwī, 'uī. 1. nvi. To squeak, squeal; to gnash, as teeth; such sounds. Cf. wī. Mea 'uwī, wringer. ho'o.uwī. Caus/sim. 2. nvt. To twist, squeeze, wring, grind; to express, as juice from fruit; to milk, as a cow. hō.'uwī. Caus/sim.
- 'uwia. 1. Pas/imp. of 'uwī 1, 2. 2. n. A split in a tree.
- 'uwiki. 1. Var. spelling of 'uiki 1-4.
- uwila. Var. spelling of uila.
- uwini.hapa. Var. spelling of winihapa.
- 'uwī. 'uwī, 'uī'uī. 1. Redup. of 'uwī 1, 2. ho'uwī. 'uwī. Redup. of hō'uwī. 2. n. A variety of triggerfish (family Balistidae), so called because it is said to make a squeaky sound. Also humuhumu. 3. vi. A ceremony to insure sharp teeth for infants: after an infant's tooth is pulled, it is passed under the knee of the child while chanting: 'Uwī'uwī ka niho o ke kanaka no ka 'iole, ka niho o ka 'iole no ke kanaka, e 'oi ka niho o [name of the child], grind the tooth of the person for the rat, the tooth of the rat for the person, so the tooth of [name] will be sharp. The tooth is thrown away so that a rat will find it and grant the sharpness of its own teeth to the new tooth that will grow in the child's mouth. To perform this ceremony. 4. n. Fermented liquor, swipes. 5. Same as ilioha, horseweeds; to use as a switch; to beat. 'Uwī'uwī aku au iā'oe a pū'alalā, I'll take a switch to you until [you] bawl.

- 'uwī'u.wiki. Var. spelling of 'ui'uiki.
- 'uwī. 'uwī lua. n. A variety of 'uwī'uwī, triggerfish.
- 'uwī wai.ū. v. To milk, as a cow. Hui 'uwī waiū, dairy.

- uwoki. Var. spelling of uoki.
