

- konu o ke kai* (Puk. 14.29), in the midst of the sea. (PEP *waenga* + PPN *tonu*.)
- waena moku.** loc. n. Amidships.
- wae wa'a.** Same as *wae* 2.
- wae.wae.** Redup. of *wae* 1; selective. See *kūlana wae-wae*. (PPN *wahewahe*.)
- wa'e.wa'e.** n. 1. Cloven hoof, as of cattle, goats, and deer. *Kaua'i*. Rare. 2. Head fisherman in charge of *kū'ula*, stone gods.
- waha.** 1. n. Mouth, opening, inner surface of a bowl, open top of a canoe, muzzle of a gun, oral, one who talks too much (see ex., *hewa* 4). See *kaka'o*, *waha wale*, *wahāwahā*. *Ma ka waha*, oral. *Waha nui*, *waha kani*, garrulous. *Kā i ka waha*, smite the speaker [said disparagingly of one who does himself what he has condemned others for doing]. *Mai lawe mai i kāna 'uala*, *he waha*, don't bring his sweet potato, [he] talks too much. **ho'o.waha.** To talk excessively; to make faces; to make an opening or furrow; to dub out a canoe, hew. (PEP *fafa*, PCP *wafa*; cf. Marquesan *fafa*.) 2. n. Neck of a dress. *Mu'umu'u waha nui*, gown (*mu'umu'u*) with a low neck. 3. nvt. To carry on the back, as a child; a load so carried. **ho'o.waha.** Caus/sim. (PPM *fafa*, PCP *wafa*.) 4. n. Square notch cut in the upper part of house posts, in which the wall plates (*lohelau*) were placed; tenon (For. 5:651).
- waha 'ā.** vs. Sharp-tongued, rude; to speak heatedly and rudely. *Lit.*, burning mouth.
- waha 'awa.** n. A bitter (*'awa*) and sadistic person who makes impulsive vindictive statements about the one he hates, attempting to strike at his weaknesses or guilts, and usually predicting misfortune that often comes true. (Nānā 197-200.)
- waha hau.ka'e.** nvs. Smearred mouth; smutty-mouthed, evil-tongued.
- waha.he'e.** nvi. To lie; lying, deceitful, false; a lie, liar. *Lit.*, slippery mouth. See ex., *keu. Kapa wahahe'e 'ana*, false impersonation.
- waha kale.** nvi. To drool at the mouth, talk excessively, gush; one who does so.
- waha kole.** nvi. Garrulous, noisy, boisterous and obstreperous in speech; such a person; to rant.
- waha ko'u.** nvi. Garrulous, clucking mouth; to gabble.
- wā hala.** n. Past tense.
- waha lapa.lapa.** nvt. To scold, utter scathing remarks; one who does so. *Lit.*, blazing mouth.
- waha.lēhē.** vs. Wide open, as a door; too large, as the neck of a dress. *Fig.*, to exaggerate. *Lit.*, wide mouth. Also *uhalehe*. **ho'o.waha.lēhē.** To stretch the mouth with fingers; to stretch out of shape, as the mouth.
- waha lina.** nvs. Finicky, of eating. *Lit.*, tight-mouthed; such a person.
- waha.mana.** n. Screen, shutter. Rare.
- waha mana.** 1. n. Voice of authority, person in authority. *Lit.*, powerful mouth. 2. nvi. One who digresses from subject to subject; to digress. *Lit.*, branching mouth.
- wā.hanē.** n. Same as *hāwane*, seed of the *loulu*.
- waha nui.** nvi. A big mouth; to talk too much, tattle; tattler.
- waha'ohi.** nvi. To talk in a foolish, silly, senseless manner; such talk; such a talker.
- Waha-o-ka-manō.** n. See *Ka-waha-o-ka-manō*.
- waha 'ō koko.** v. To slander one's own blood. *Lit.*, mouth that pierces blood.
- waha 'ō.lelo.** n. Spokesman, mouthpiece, herald; speaking mouth.
- waha.pa'a.** vt. To goad, tease, banter; argumentative. *Lit.*, hard mouth.
- waha pala.** n. A coated mouth, said in derision of an ignoramus, especially one who does not know the chants honoring his chief.
- waha pilo.** n. Halitosis; foul mouth.
- waha pio.** To be unable to speak; not to da e to speak, speechless. *Lit.*, imprisoned mouth.
- waha pu'u.** n. Protruding lips; unintelligible speech, as of one who has had a stroke. *Lit.*, lumpy mouth.
- waha'ula.** vt. To nibble and pick at food without appetite. *Lit.*, red [sore] mouth.
- wahā.wahā.** vt. To treat with contempt, scorn, despise, abhor, ridicule; be disgusted, defy. **ho'o.wahā.wahā.** Caus/sim. Cf. *waha* 1. *Ho'owahāwahā i ka 'aha*, contempt of court. (PCP *wafa(a)wafa(a)*.)
- waha.wai.** vt. To talk glibly, brag. *Lit.*, watery mouth.
- waha wale.** vs. Deceitful, lying. *Lit.*, slimy mouth.
- waha wali.** vs. Glib-tongued.
- wā he'e.** n. Time when *he'e* (octopus) abound.
- wā heu 'ole.** n. Time of beardless youth, preadolescence. *Lit.*, time without whiskers.
- wahi.** 1. n. Place, location, position, site, setting. (*Ka wahi* contracts to common *kahi*.) *Ma kekahi wahi*, somewhere. *Kēlā wahi kēia wahi*, everywhere. *Ma ia mau wahi*, hereabouts, thereabouts. *Ma nā wahi āpau*, everywhere, wherever, universal. *Ua hele akula lāua ia wahi a'e*, *ia wahi a'e*, they went everywhere. *Iā'oe ia wahi*, none of your business [rude]; it's your turn [polite]. (PPN *fa'asi*, PCP *wa(a)si*.) 2. Paucal article. Some, a little, a bit of. (Gram. 10.2.) *E 'olu'olu 'oe i wahi wai*, please a little water. *He wahi makana kēia*, this is just a little gift. *'A'ohē wahi ā ne'ene'eu mai*, does not bestir at all. (PCP *wa(a)si*.) 3. idiom. To say, according to (usually followed by the possessive *a* or by a zero-class possessive and not preceded by either verb or noun particles). *Wahi a wai?* Who said so? *Wahi a ke ali'i*, the chief said. *Wahi a kahiko*, according to the ancients.
- wahī.** nvt. Wrapper, envelope, case, covering, sheath; a ti-leaf bundle; to wrap, cover, bundle up, fold up, roll up, swathe; to dress, as a wound. Cf. *'ili wahī, kīpē*. *Wahī makaaniani*, glasses case. *Ā wahī ihola 'oia i nā papa i ke gula* (Puk. 36.34), and he overlaid the boards with gold. (PEP *fa'asi*, but cf. Marquesan *fafi*, *vahi* [long vowels are not marked].)
- wāhi.** vt. To cleave, split, burst through, break through; to change, as money; to have sex relations with a virgin, deflower. Cf. *wāwahi*. *O wāhi mai, ē Lono, o wāhi 'o luna, o wāhi 'o lalo, o wāhi ka uka, o wāhi ke kai* (prayer to Lono for rain), break through, O Lono, break through above, break through below, may the uplands break through, may the lowlands break through. *E wāhi mai i ka berena e ola ai* (hymn), break the bread of life. **ho'o.wāhi.** Caus/sim. (PNP *fa'asi*, PCP *waasi*.)
- wāhia.** Pas/imp. of *wāhi*. *Ka hūlili pa'a 'a'oe e wāhia* (chant for Ka-lā-kaua), the strong bridge that cannot be broken. (PCP *wafia*.)
- wā hia.moe.** n. Time to sleep, bedtime.
- wahie.** 1. nvi. Fuel, firewood; to serve as firewood. (PPN *fafie*, PCP *wafie*.) 2. n. Stroke in spear or club fighting.
- wahie'eke'eke.** n. Upper stroke in club fighting. (RC 59.)
- wahī'eha.** n. Bandage.
- wahie-o-ke-ola.** n. Lignum vitae (*Guaiacum officinale*), a small tree from tropical America, with heavy, hard wood, useful for many purposes. The resin yields medicine and stain. The tree is also ornamental, each leaf with two or three pairs of rounded leaflets, the flowers blue and clustered, the fruits yellow and heart-shaped. (Neal 476.)
- wahi hana.** n. Workshop, place to work.
- wahi hā.nai holo.holona, wahi hā.nai pipi.** n. Cattle ranch.
- wahi hila.hila.** n. Private parts.
- wahi ho'āhu 'ō.pala.** n. Dump, garbage pile.
- wahi ho'o.malu.** n. Shelter.
- wahi ho'o.pau pili.kia.** n. Toilet, rest room.
- wahi ka'a.wale.** n. Vacant place, vacancy.
- wahi kia'i.** n. Lookout.
- wahi kū moku.** n. Anchorage.
- wahīlawe pepa.** n. Brief case.
- wahīleka.** n. Envelope.
- wahi lulu.** n. Shelter.
- wahī maka.ani.ani.** n. Glasses case.
