

- was like bath water for him [of heroes dodging spears or engaged in fights; the hail of spears is as pleasant as splashing water].
- wai 'awa.** nvs. Poisoned or bitter water; bitter. *Fig.*, same as *poli 'awa*.
- wai 'awa.'awa.** Redup. of *wai 'awa*. *Imua ē nā pōki'i ā inu i ka wai 'awa'awa*, forward, young ones, and drink the bitter water [exhortation of Ka-mehameha to his warriors at the battle of 'Ī-ao; i.e., face danger!].
- wai.awī.** n. The yellow strawberry guava (*Psidium cattleianum* f. *lucidum*), a small tree, like the *waiawī 'ula-ula* in many ways but bearing larger, yellow fruit. (Neal 634.)
- wai.awī 'ula.'ula.** n. The purple strawberry guava (*Psidium cattleianum*), a small tree from Brazil, with smooth bark, smooth, shiny, obovate leaves about 5 cm long. The purplish-red fruit is round, about 2.5 cm in diameter, and has white pulp, good to eat raw or made into jam or jelly, tasting like strawberries. (Neal 633-4.)
- wai ea.** n. 1. Aerated water. 2. Small house at the entrance of a heiau temple, where the ceremonial 'aha (cord) was stretched. (Malo 162.) 3. Sea water used for purification. *Lit.*, water of life.
- wai.ehu.** n. A file; formerly a rough stone used to grind and polish.
- wai.ehu.** n. Spraying water.
- wai.'ele.** 1. n. Black tapa dye; tapa so dyed. 2. vt. To drug fish with 'auhuhu.
- wai.'ele.'ele.** n. 1. Black dye. 2. Ink. 3. A dark-skinned person.
- wai'eli.** n. Well water, well. *Lit.*, dug water.
- wai.hā.** n. Water upon which the breath (*hā*) of the priest has been expelled in order to impart mana; to give mana by breathing upon an image or person; to request earnestly in prayer. See ex., *waipā*.
- wai.hae.** n. Agricultural land term commonly used in the 1840s, especially on Maui; meaning unknown.
- wai hā.nai.** n. Small well from which brackish water was taken and poured into shallow pools called *wai kū*; this water later was placed into shallower pools and allowed to evaporate, leaving the salt. *Kaua'i*.
- wai.hau.** 1. n. A heiau where hogs, bananas, and coconuts were sacrificed, but not human beings; a heiau for *mo'o* spirits. 2. nvt. A small, tight bundle; to do up in such a bundle. *Rare*.
- wai hau.** n. Ice water.
- wai hī.** n. Water oozing as from a precipice or trickling down. *Lit.*, purging water.
- wā.'ihi.** Short for *wai 'ihi*.
- wai hili.** n. Water obtained by shaking the dew or rain drops from the leaves of plants or trees, as was said to have been done in dry areas. *Lit.*, hit water.
- waiho.** nvt. To leave, lay or put down, place before, present, refer, submit, place in nomination, file, deposit, set aside, exclude, evacuate, abdicate, desist, cease, stop, omit, quit, resign, abandon, remain; to table, as a motion; a leaving, depository, etc. (Coalescence of *wai 4* and the directional *iho*.) Cf. *palapala waiho 'oihana*, *waihona*, *waiho wale* and Gram. 2.7. *Waiho make*, to be left as though dead; to be faint; unconscious. *Waiho 'ao'ao*, to lie on the side; heeled over, as a ship. 'O ka *waiho ha'aha'a 'ana aku*, respectfully submitting. *Waiho i kahi moe*, lie sick in bed, bedridden. *Ua pani 'ia ka waiho 'ana a'e i nā inoa*, the nominations were closed. *Waiho akula 'oia i kāna pu'upu'u*, he laid to with his fists. 'A'ole au e *waiho iā'oe*, e 'eha ana 'oe ia'u, I won't spare you, I will inflict punishment on you. *Ka waiho helahela mai o nā Ko'olau*, the panoramic view of the Ko'olau. *Waiho 'ai*, to fast. 'O ka *waiho 'ana o ka 'āina* (old land claim), the lay of the land. *Waiho 'ia*, left, entrusted. **ho'o.waiho.** To leave, abandon, ignore, shun; to expose or leave naked. *Ua ho'owaiho maila ia i ka pōki'i*, he shunned the younger brother. (PCP *waifo*.)
- wai.hoa.** Pas/imp. of *waiho*.
- wai hō.'a'ala.** n. Toilet water, liquid spice, scented extract. *Lit.*, liquid that perfumes.
- waiho akaaka, waiho.kāka.** vt. To lie or place in full view; easily seen, obvious.
- wai ho'āno.** n. Holy water.
- waiho kā.hela.** vi. To lie widespread before one.
- waiho loa.** vt. To abandon completely, give up.
- wai.holo.moku.** n. Flood. *Ua kahe noho'i ka waiholo-moku* (Hal. 124.5), the waters have gone over.
- waiho mahi 'ole.** vi. To lie fallow.
- waiho ma'i.** vi. To lie sick, remain sick.
- wai.hona.** nvs. Depository, closet, cabinet, vault, file, receptacle, savings, place for laying up things in safe-keeping; internal organs of the body, funds, treasury; fiscal. (*Wai 4 + iho*, directional, + *-na*, nominalizer.) Numerous types of *waihona* are listed below. *Hale waihona puke*, library. *Hana waihona kālā*, fiscal service. *Waihona nui o ka Teritori*, general fund of the Territory. *Waihona o ka na'auao*, repository of learning [a learned person].
- wai.hona 'āina.** n. Position of the land, lay of the land, position of the earth, landscape, panorama, scenery, topography.
- wai.hona ho'o.mana'o.** n. Memory.
- wai.hona ho'o.nanea.** n. Playroom, parlor; private rooms of the captain of a ship.
- wai.hona 'ike.** n. Intelligence.
- wai.hona ipu.** n. Cupboard, place to keep food containers; bases supporting bath basins in Solomon's temple (1 Nal. 7.35).
- wai.hona kā.lā (dala).** n. Treasury, money depository, fund; fiscal. *Lit.*, dollar depository. See ex., *kūpiliki'i*.
- wai.hona keiki.** n. Womb.
- wai.hona kukui.** n. Candlestick, lamp stand. *Waihona kukui gula* (1 Oihn. 28.15), candlesticks of gold.
- wai.hona kupa.pa'u.** n. Burial vault.
- wai.hona lako kaua.** n. Arsenal, arms depository. *Lit.*, war goods depository.
- wai.hona lā.nahu.** n. Coalbin.
- wai.hona mea la'a.** n. Place for sacred objects; treasure (Neh. 7.70).
- wai.hona meli.** n. Honeycomb. (1 Sam. 14.27.)
- wai.hona moni.** n. Place for keeping money, treasury. *Rare*.
- wai.hona no'o.no'o.** n. Mind, mentality.
- wai.hona 'ō.pala.** n. Dump, garbage container.
- wai.hona pā ipu.** n. Cupboard.
- wai.hona pala.pala kahiko.** n. Archives. *Lit.*, depository of ancient documents.
- wai.hona pana.kō.** n. Bank account, depository.
- wai.hona puke (buke).** n. Library.
- wai.hona wai.wai.** n. Treasury, depository for goods, property; treasurer. (2 Oihn. 5.1.)
- wai ho'o.hehe'e.** n. Digestive juice.
- wai ho'o.hui.** nvs. Water color.
- waiho ola.** v. To spare the life, to remain living.
- wai.ho'o.lu'u.** nv. Color, dye, coloring liquid; to impart scent. *Pa'a i ka waiho'olu'u*, dyed, colored. *He aha ka waiho'olu'u o kēlā pua?* What is the color of that flower?
- wai ho'o.ma'e.ma'e.** n. Disinfectant; any kind of cleaning liquid, cleansing liquid, liquid soap.
- waiho wale.** vt. To leave without reason; to leave about carelessly; to set aside as useless; to neglect, to expose to view. *Lumi waiho wale*, room left unused. *Mai waiho wale i kō puke o lilo i ka 'aihue*, don't just leave your book around or a thief will take it.
- wai hū.** n. Gushing spring, overflowing water.
- wai hua.** n. Water-drop caught as in a taro leaf, much liked for purification and medicine, as it has not touched the earth. Also called *wai 'apo*.
- wai hui.kala.** n. Water for purification.
- wai 'ihi.** n. Sacred blood, as of royalty. *Fig.*, prominent, royal.
- wai.iki.** n. A kidney disease that impedes urination. *Lit.*, little water.
