

- wai inu.** n. Drinking water, potable water.
- wai.kahe.** nvi. Stream (Hal. 124.4); to flow, overflow, as a stream. *Lit.*, flowing water. See ex., *mokuhia*. *Waikahe nui*, torrent. (PPN *waitafe*.)
- wai kahi.** vs. United, of one dye. See ex., *kāo'o*.
- wāi.kāhuli.** 1. n. A calliopsis (*Coreopsis tinctoria*), an annual ornamental herb, in the daisy family, from central United States, the ray flowers yellow with dark-red at the base. (Neal 842.) *Lit.*, change [of] color. 2. See *aloalo*, hibiscus. 3. See *melekule wai kāhuli*.
- wai kai.** n. Brackish or salty water.
- wai.kā.lā (dala).** nvs. Quicksilver, mercury; silver, silver-colored. *Lit.*, silver liquid.
- wai.kanaka.** vs. Having ways of ordinary folk. *Rare*. *Lit.*, human pattern.
- wai.kaua.** 1. n. A war temple. 2. Same as *waiwai kaua*.
- wai.kōa.** n. Juice of fresh *kukui* nuts, as mixed with fresh or brackish water and used as an enema. *Lit.*, white liquid.
- wai.kōkō.** Same as *wekekē*, whiskey.
- wai kō'o.kō'o.** n. Leucorrhea. *Lit.*, white liquid.
- wai.kī.** n. 1. Gun. *Rare*. See *pōhaku waikī*. 2. Enema of a concoction consisting of the juice of the poisonous gourd, water, salt, and other matter, drastic and painful. Cf. the more mild *waikea*. 3. Gonorrhea, of males; painful urination, perhaps due to cystitis. *Rare*. *Koko waikī*, blood discharge in urine. 4. One whose father was a chief but whose mother was not, a term of contempt. *Rare*. Cf. *'ahunāli'i*.
- wai kī.** n. Water in which tea has been brewed, tea.
- Wai-kī.kī.** n. Place name used as a direction marker in Honolulu. *Lit.*, spouting water. *Ma ka 'ao'ao Wai-kīkī*, on the Wai-kīkī side.
- wai kō.** n. 1. Water with a strong current. 2. Sugary water.
- wai ko'ana wai.ū paka.** n. Buttermilk.
- wai.kō.'ihi.** n. Waterspout. Cf. *waipu'ilani*.
- Wai-kō-loa.** n. Cold wind associated with Mt. Ka'ala, O'ahu, and the nearby place of the same name (FS 282).
- wai.ko'o.lihi.lihi.** n. Tears that seem to cling to eyelashes. *Lit.*, liquid supporting eyelashes. *Poetic*.
- wai.kū.** Same as *nae waikū*. (For. 6:451.)
- wai kū.** See *wai hānai*.
- wai kula (gula).** vs. Gold-colored.
- wai.kū.lono.'ako'a.ko'a.** n. An old name for syphilis.
- wai.kulu.** n. Alcohol.
- wai.kū.ōa.** n. Dart, as for war. *Rare*.
- wai lā.'au.** n. 1. Sap of plants. 2. Liquid medicine.
- wai.lana.** 1. nvs. Calm, quiet, as the sea; still water. 2. nvs. Banished, as for unworthy conduct; exile. (Perhaps *wai 4*, to leave, + *-lana*, nominalizer; Gram. 6.6.2.) 3. n. A prayer uttered to free a taboo period.
- wai lani.** n. Rain water, especially as used for medicine and purification. Cf. *wai hua*.
- wai.lau.** n. 1. Large leaf bundles of food, as poi, for carrying. 2. An ancient variety of tapa. (For. 5:112.)
- Wai-lau.** n. Place names on Hawai'i, Kaua'i, and Moloka'i.
- wai lau.lau.** n. Water carried in folded taro leaves.
- Wai.leia.** n. Name of a morning star.
- wai.lele.** n. Waterfall, cataract, cascade. *Lit.*, leaping water. (PCP *wailele*; cf. Marquesan *vai'e'e*.)
- wai lēmi.** n. Lemon juice, lemonade, limeade.
- wai.lēna.** n. Bile. *Lit.*, yellow water.
- wai.lewa.** n. Coconut water. *Lit.*, hanging water. See riddle, *lewa 1*.
- wai.li'i.li'i.** n. A decorated tapa. *Lit.*, small colors.
- wai.li'u.** Same as *waili'ulā*. *Aloha i ka waili'u o ka 'āina* (PH 116), greeting to the mirage of the land.
- wai.li'u.lā.** 1. n. Mirage. 2. nvs. Of changing color, as taffeta or a stone; taffeta.
- Wai-loa.** n. Name of a star near the Pleiades, said to be a member of the group called *Kaulua*. It is also said to be a name of an ancient chief. *Lit.*, long stream.
- wai.lua.** n. 1. Spirit, ghost; remains of the dead. *Ho'i*
- ho'i 'ia aku kona kino wailua ā ho'omoe 'ia maloko o ka pā ilina*, his remains were taken and laid away in the cemetery. (PEP *wailua*.) 2. An ancient variety of sweet potato, presumably introduced from Wai-lua, Kaua'i.
- wai Lū.kini.** n. Perfume. *Lit.*, Russian liquor, so-called because musk was obtained from Russians in early days, the wet product being perfume. Cf. *hualūkini*, For. 5:656.
- wai.luku.** 1. n. Name reported for an *ulu* fishing line. 2. Same as *haleloke*, a chrysanthemum.
- Wai-luku.** n. A West Maui city, site of a late eighteenth century battle. *Lit.*, destructive water.
- wai.mā.hōe.hōe.** vt. To strip the flesh from bones, as for burial.
- wai.maka.** n. Tears. *Lit.*, eye water. See ex., *pania*. (PEP *waimata*.)
- wai.maka-ia-kohi.** n. Name of a minor illness (no data).
- wai.maka lehua.** n. Waterdrops from the 'ōhi'a lehua tree; euphemism for menstruation. Also *waimaka-o-lehua*.
- wai.maka.nui.** n. 1. An endemic fern (*Thelypteris ke-raudreniana*), with large, broad, pale, subdivided fronds, the last divisions triangular or oblong, the spores arranged in small dots scattered on the frond back. Also *ala'alai*. 2. A native fern (*Pteris excelsa*), with large, broad, bright-green, subdivided fronds, in general like *waimakanui 1*, but the last divisions longer and subfalcate, and the spores arranged in a line under the curled frond margin.
- wai.maka-o-Pele.** n. Pele's tears.
- wai-maka-ua.** n. Services to get rain. (For. 6:153.)
- wai.mano.** 1. Stone from which octopus sinkers were made. (Malo 19.) 2. Adobe. (AP.)
- wai.meā.** n. 1. Maui name for *olomea*, a shrub. 2. Kaua'i name for a kind of *māmaki*, having leaves with red veins and stems resembling those of the *olomea*.
- Wai-meā.** n. A place name. *Lit.*, reddish water. See ex., *pā 'ili*.
- wai meā 'ino.** n. Slop.
- wai meli.** n. Honey. *Lit.*, bee liquor.
- wai mimi.** n. Urine. (2 Nal. 18.27.)
- wai momona.** n. Soda water, sweet water.
- wai.mū.heā.** Same as *kaupō*, a native banana.
- waina.** n. 1. Place with water. 2. Depository. See *wai 4*. *Pū-o-waina* (Hawaiian name for Punchbowl, Honolulu), hill of deposits [human sacrifices]. 3. Pyorrhea, bleeding gums. 4. Wine. *Eng*. See *pā waina*. 5. Isabella grape (*Vitis xlabruscana*), a strong-climbing vine, bearing blue, loose-skinned fruits. This is a hybrid that succeeds best of any grape introduced to Hawai'i; little interest has been shown in the past in the grape industry. (Neal 542-3.) See *hua waina*.
- Wai-naku.** n. Star name, sometimes called the patron star of Hilo.
- waina malo'o.** n. Raisins. *Lit.*, dry grapes.
- wai niu.** n. Coconut water or cream (the distinction was not clear; cf. *kai niu*, *wailewa*). *Wai o ka niu*, coconut cream.
- wai.nohia.** 1. Probably similar to *waipahē*. *Nanea wai-nohia no Maka-kēhau*, [a] pleasant [and] agreeable [story] about Maka-kēhau. 2. Safe, safety. (And.)
- wai nui.** nvi. A large flow of water; excessive flow of saliva; to flow in great quantities, juicy.
- wai.oha.** Same as *ohaoha*, joy.
- wai.'ō.hi'a.** n. A variety of sugar cane.
- wai 'ō.hi'a.** n. Juice or cider of mountain apples; cider in general; tomato juice.
- wai.ohinu.** n. All kinds of cultivated dahlias (*Dahlia* spp.), named for a town on Hawai'i where the plant was first grown. (Neal 843-4.) *Pika waiohinu*, vase or pitcher of dahlias [name of an old quilt design showing a pitcher containing dahlias].
- wai.okila.** See *pāpale waiokila*.
- wai.oleka.** n. Fragrant cultivated violets (as *Viola odorata*). (Neal 591.) *Eng*. See *nani Wai-'ale'ale* (native violets).
