

- wai.olina**. n. Violin. *Eng.* See *ex.*, *nē*.
wai.olina kū. n. Cello.
wai.olina kū nui. n. Bass viol.
Wai-olo.hia. n. A Kaua'i wind. (For. 5:97.)
wai.olono. vs. Careful, cautious about what one says. *Rare*.
wai'olu. vs. Cool, pleasant, attractive, soft, gentle, pleasing. *Kou piko wai'olu* (song), your pleasant private parts.
wai'ona. n. Intoxicating liquor or spirits. *Hō'ole wai'ona*, prohibition of intoxicants.
wai'ono. n. Honey, sweet liquid.
wai'o'opu. n. Type of tapa.
wai'ō.pua. n. 1. A disease similar to pulmonary consumption. 2. Leucorrhea.
Wai'ō.pua. n. Name of a pleasant breeze at Wai-lua, Kaua'i. (For. 5:97.) *Lit.*, water of cloud banks.
wai'ō.upō. n. Mirage. *Lit.*, deceiving water.
wai.pā. n. Request, prayer, as to the gods. *Pēlā ka'u waihā me ka'u wai-pā aku iā'oe, ē ke akua*, such is my request and prayer to you, O god.
wai.pa'a. n. Ice. (Ioba 6.16.) *Lit.*, hard, solid water.
wai pa'a.kai. n. Salty water, brine.
wai.pahē. vs. Courteous, gentlemanly, polite, modest, gentle, good-natured, easygoing, agreeable, complacent, gracious. This word is usually used in a favorable sense, but occasionally pejoratively: *he wahine waipahē wale ma nā mea 'ano 'ino*, a woman complacent indeed in the ways of sin.
wai.pahū. n. Gunpowder. *Lit.*, explosive liquid.
wai pahū. n. Spouting water, geyser.
wai pa'i.pa'i. n. Mixed liquid, solution, or drink of any kind (*lama pa'ipa'i* is more common for alcoholic drinks).
wai.palu.palu. n. Name recorded for a variety of sweet potato.
wai-palu.palu. n. A kind of tapa. *Lit.*, soft dye or pattern.
Wai-paoa. n. Cool breeze famous at Wai-mea, Kaua'i. *Lit.*, scooped water.
wai.pēhē. Var. of *waipahē*.
wai pi'i. nvi. Rising water, overflow of water, flood (Ier. 46.7); to flow, overflow.
wai pi'i.pi'i, **wai pipi'i**. Redup. of *wai pi'i*; charged water, bubbling water.
wai piula. n. Water from a faucet.
wai.pū. n. Gunpowder. *Rare*.
wai pua. n. Honey from flowers.
wai puhia. n. Wind-blown water or spray, as of a waterfall; name of the "upside-down" waterfall in Nu'u-anu Valley.
wai.pu'i.lani. n. Waterspout (perhaps from *wai puhi lani*, heaven-blown water). *I ka halulu mau 'ana o kou waipu'ilani* (Hal. 42.7), at the noise of thy waterspouts.
wai puna. n. Spring water. *Fig.*, a sweetheart. (PPN *wai puna*.)
wai pū'olo. n. Water in leaves, as of taro, that could be carried; coconut water. *Lit.*, bundled water.
wai pū'olo i ka lau lā'au. n. An ancient name for ice. *Lit.*, water in a package of tree leaves, so called because ice was said to be brought down from the mountains in leaves. (Malo 241-2.)
wai.ū. n. Milk; a wet nurse; breast. *Lit.*, breast liquid. *Kau ka waiū*, breasts filled with milk. *Keiki waiū*, nursing child. *Ho'okau i ka waiū*, to perform ceremonies to make the breasts fill with milk. *Lele ka waiū*, breast milk has ceased to flow. *Ho'olele i ka waiū*, to perform ceremonies to make the breast cease flowing. *He 'āina e kahe ana ka waiū a me ia meli* (Nah. 14.8), a land which flows with milk and honey. (PNP *waiuu*.)
wai ua. n. Rain water.
wai.ū haki. n. A breast that sags, but not long or pendulous. *Lit.*, broken breast.
wai.ū.haku.haku. n. Clabbered milk, cottage cheese. *Lit.*, lumpy milk.
wai.ū hē'ē.hē'ē. n. Caked breast.
wai.ū ho'o.hui.hui. n. Milk combined with other ingredients, as for a baby or person on a liquid diet; formula. *Lit.*, mixed milk.
wai.ū kahe. n. Flowing breast or milk.
wai.ū kau. n. Breast filled with milk.
wai.ū kia. n. Condensed milk. *Lit.*, deer milk, so called because the first cans of condensed milk had a picture of deer on the label.
wai.ū kini. n. Canned milk.
wai.ū.ko'a. n. A breast that has milk from the beginning of pregnancy to long after weaning.
wai'ula. n. Red liquid, blood, menstrual flow; rain runoff red with soil.
Wai-uli. n. Name of a wind, Honolulu, Maui. (For. 5:101.)
wai'ū.lili. vt. To fix firmly. Cf. *'ūlili 8. 'O kēia mau mea auane'i apau a'u e 'ōlelo aku nei iā'oe lā, e wai'ūlili a'e 'oe a pa'a i loko o kou nā'au*, all these things I will tell you, you should fix them firmly in your mind.
wai.ū luli.luli. n. Milk shake.
wai.ū.pa'a. n. Cheese. (1 Sam. 17.18.) *Lit.*, solidified milk.
wai.ū pa'i.pa'i. n. Diluted milk.
wai.ū.paka, waiu bata. n. Butter.
wai.ū.paka.pa'a. n. Cheese. *Lit.*, solidified butter.
wai.ū pu'u. n. Budding breast, as of a young girl.
wai.wai. nvs. Goods, property, assets, valuables, value, worth, wealth, importance, benefit, estate, use; useful, valuable, rich, costly, financial. (Probably related to *wai 4*, to retain, rather than to *wai 1*, water.) See *kumu waiwai, waiwai 'ole. Waiwai i hao 'ia*, booty, spoils, goods of any kind seized or appropriated. *Waiwai ki-ko'olā*, miscellaneous valuables. *Ho'oponopono waiwai*, administrator of property or of an estate. *Waiwai loa'a ma ke kolohe*, ill-gotten gains. *Kōmike waiwai*, financial committee. **ho'o.wai.wai**. To enrich, bring prosperity.
wai.wai hapa 'umi. n. Tithe, tithing. *Lit.*, one-tenth property.
wai.wai ho'o.ilina. n. Inherited property, heritage, estate.
wai.wai ho'o.lilo. n. Exports.
wai.wai ho'o.pa'a. n. Security, fixed assets. *Lit.*, solid property.
wai.wai ho'o.pae mai. n. Imports.
wai.wai ho'o.pae malū. n. Smuggled goods.
wai.wai ho'o.puka. n. Profits.
wai.wai hui. n. Assets. *Lit.*, combined wealth.
wai.wai inoa. n. Par value, as of stocks. *Lit.*, name value.
wai.wai 'i'o. n. True worth, as of heirlooms; marked value, as of stocks.
wai.wai kā.lepa. n. Merchandise.
wai.wai kua. n. War goods, spoils.
wai.wai kau.like. n. Par value, just value.
wai.wai koko ola. n. Wealth taken to cause by sorcery the death of an innocent person—this was punishable by the sorcerer's own death. (Kam. 64:120.) *Lit.*, live blood goods.
wai.wai koko pī.lau. n. Wealth taken to cause by sorcery the death of a sorcerer who had prayed others to death. (Kam. 64:120.) *Lit.*, foul blood goods.
wai.wai komo. n. Imports.
wai.wai kū'ai. n. Investments. (Will 129, 1856, State Archives.)
wai.wai lewa. n. Movable or personal property; liquid assets; chattel. *Moraki waiwai lewa*, chattel mortgage.
wai.wai maloko. n. Tribute or wealth from the uplands.
wai.wai nui. n. Great wealth, fortune.
wai.wai 'ole. vs. Worthless, useless, of no use or value, good-for-nothing.
wai.wai pa'a. n. Real estate, property that cannot be moved.
wai.wai pio. n. Booty, plunder, spoils (Puk. 15.9).
wai.wai puka aku. n. Exports.
