

your voice is. **3.** n. The *wī* tree (*Spondias dulcis*), a smooth, gray-barked tree in the mango family, from islands of the South Pacific. The round or ovoid orange fruits, called *wī* apples, are 2.5 or more cm in diameter, have apple-flavored, yellow pulp surrounding a core with a few seeds. (Neal 523.) (PPN *wii*.) **4.** n. The tamarind (*Tamarindus indica*), a large leguminous tree from tropical Africa and possibly Asia, grown for shade and ornament, and for the wood and fruit. The brown pod contains a few seeds embedded in sticky, brown, acid pulp, which is eaten or made into a drink. (Neal 417.) Sometimes called *wī 'awa'awa*. (PPN *wii*.) **5.** See *hīhī wai 1*, a grainy snail. **6.** n. A female *kīkī*, a bird.

wihī. Same as *'āwihī*, to wink.

wī.kani. vs. Strong, hard, rigid, inflexible. *Wīkani nā a'ahuki*, hard tendons.

wī.kā'o. Same as *wīkani*; dry. *Rare*.

wīkēkē, wīsekē. n. Whiskey. *Eng.*

wiki. vs. To hurry, hasten; quick, fast, swift. See *alawiki*. *Hele wiki*, quick time, quick step. *E wiki 'oe, mai lohi* (FS 111), hurry, don't delay. (Probably PEP *witi*, although Easter Island *witi* may be a Tahitian loan.)

ho'o.wiki. To hurry, hasten.

wiki.lia, vigilia. n. Vigil. (Latin *vigilia*.)

wikili.ola, vitiriola. n. Vitriol. *Eng.*

wiki.wama. n. Wigwam.

wiki.wiki. **1.** Redup. of *wiki*, fast, speedy. (PEP *witi-witi*, but see *wiki*.) **2.** (*Cap.*) n. Star name (no data). (Kuhelani.)

wiko, vito. nvt. Veto; to veto. *Eng.*

wiko.lia. n. **1.** A fine lawn used in dresses; victoria lawn. **2.** (*Cap.*) Victoria. *Eng.*

wile.laiki. n. The Christmas-berry tree (*Schinus terebinthifolius*), a rather small tree, from Brazil, the leaves compound, each leaf having about seven leaflets, the flowers whitish, small, in large bunches, the small red fruits of the female tree abundant, resembling those of the *pūkiawe*. Named for Willie Rice, who during political campaigns wore a hat lei of the red berries. (Neal 525.)

wili. **1.** nvt. To wind, twist, writhe, crank, turn, screw, drill, bore; to dial, crank, or ring up, as on the telephone; to roll up, as a mat; crank, coil, lock, as of hair. See *ma'i wili, wili lauoho, Wili mawaho*, whip [on a sewing machine]. *Wili Ko'olau*, Ko'olau whirlwind [careless, hurried work]. *Ma ka 'ākau, wili*, right, turn. *Ua wili 'ia kou niho me ka mīkini wili*, your tooth was drilled with the drill. **ho'o.wili.** To wind, coil, twine, drill, turn; to mill about, as a school of fish. (PPN *wili*.) **2.** n. Mill, drill, wrench, bit; various implements or machines used for turning are listed below. Cf. *hale wili. Nā mea wili* (Nah. 11.8), mills. **3.** n. Spirals of several colors in composite leis, as of the cigar flower (*kīkā*). **4.** n. A bird (no data). (KL line 420.)

wilia. Pas/imp. of *wili 1*. *Ka liko o ka palai i wilia me ke 'ala* (name song), the young fern frond is interwoven with fragrance.

wili 'ā.T. v. To twist the neck; bulldog.

wili.au. vi. To stir, circulate, move in eddies; mixed currents and eddies; turbulent. See ex., *Ikā 1*.

wili.kā. 'ekā. vs. Snarled, tangled, as hair.

wili.kā.hēi. n. Bit for boring, drilling. *Lit.*, circling drill.

wili.kī. nvs. Engineer, turnkey; engineering. *Lit.*, turn key.

wili.kī.kī.wila. n. Civil engineer.

wili.kina. n. Sister, nun (Catholic). *Eng.* virgin.

Wili.kine, Virigine. n. Virgin. *Eng.* See ex., *epukane*.

wili.kō. nv. Sugar mill, sugar grinder, to grind sugar cane.

wili.kō.T. n. Dust or trash blown by the wind. *Rare*.

wili.kope. n. Coffee mill, coffee grinder.

wili.lau.oho. n. Locks of hair (Mele 5.2); false human hair twisted to fall down from the back, like a hair switch, described by Samwell of the Cook expedition (J. C. Beaglehole 1967, Part 2:1179; Buck 562-3).

wili.makani. n. Windmill.

wili.mo'o. vi. To turn, twist, writhe, as a reptile. **ho'o.wili.mo'o.** (a) Same as above. *Lele mai ke kanaka mā-lalaioa me ka ho'owilimo'o, me ka hō'oni puhi 'ana o kona kino*, the tall slim man leaped in with a twist and turn, his body moving like that of an eel. (b) Ceremony during *luakini* or war temple dedication. For a *pule ho'owilimo'o* see Malo 185. (c) Quadrille dance.

wili.nau. vi. To writhe, twist, wriggle.

wili.nui. n. Auger.

wili.ohi 'ili.kope. n. Mill for peeling coffee beans.

wili 'ō.hiki.kulina. n. Corn sheller or husker.

wili.oho. n. Coil or strand of hair, as in a *lei palaoa* necklace. *Ka wili oho o ka lani nui* (For. 6:413), the hair dresser of the great chief.

wili. 'ō.kā'i. **1.** n. Chrysalis of night moth (*'ōkā'i*), cocoon. Also *'ōwili'ōkā'i*. **2.** nvi. To whirl, bluster, as wind. *Ka wili'ōkā'i a ka Unulau*, the whirling turning of the Unulau wind.

wili.papa. n. Planing mill.

wili.peahi. n. Fan, as for cleaning seeds.

wili.pua'a. n. Corkscrew, hand drill, gimlet, screw auger (a euphemism for *ulepua'a*).

wili.wai. n. Eddy, whirlpool. *Ua ka'aniniau i ka wiliwai*, tossed in the whirlpools [of love].

wili.wehe 'umoki. n. Corkscrew.

wili.wili. **1.** Redup. of *wili 1*. *Pā wiliwili*, blowing of wind in all directions. **ho'o.wili.wili.** Redup. of *ho'o-wili*; to swirl, circle. *Ho'owiliwili ka ua i ka 'ino*, the rain swirls in the storm. *Ho'owiliwili ka i'a*, the fish swim in circles. (PPN *wiliwili*.) **2.** n. A Hawaiian leguminous tree (*Erythrina sandwicensis*, formerly called *E. monosperma*), found on dry coral plains and on lava flows, somewhat spiny, with short thick trunk. Each leaf has three ovate leaflets; flowers are clustered near branch ends and range in color from red to orange, yellow, white; pods contain red, oblong seeds, used for leis. The wood is very light and formerly was used for surfboards, canoe outriggers, net floats. (Neal 458-60.) See ex., *pua 1*.

wili.wili.haole. n. The tiger's-claw (*Erythrina variegata* var. *orientalis*, synonym *E. indica*), distributed from India to southern Polynesia, resembling the native *wili-wili* in many ways but larger and commonly grown ornamentally in Hawai'i for its large, bright-red flowers. (Neal 460.)

wili.wili.wai. n. Lawn sprinkler. See song, *ko'iawe*.

wī.lou. n. Willow. (Isa. 44.4.) *Eng.*

wī.lou.loha.loha. n. Weeping willow. *Lit.*, drooping willow.

wīlu. Same as *weko*, stink, stench.

wīlu.wīlu. Redup. of *wīlu*.

wī.nēka, vinēga. n. Vinegar. *Eng.*

wini. **1.** vs. Sharp, as a point. *Fig.*, impudent, nery. Cf. *'auwiniwini. Ua wini kākala*, the spurs are sharp [said of a youth who has reached manhood]. *Wini 'i'o nō!* How sharp! [Such boldness, nerve!] **ho'o.wini.** To sharpen, make a point. **2.** n. Wind. *Pea wini*, fair wind.

wini.hapa, uinihapa, uwinihapa. n. Brick, named for Captain Winship, said to have brought the first bricks to Hawai'i.

wini.wini. Redup. of *wini 1*; tapering, ridged. *Ihu wini-wini*, sharp nose.

wi.ola, viola. n. Viol. (Am. 6.5.) *Eng.*

wi.ola 'umi, viola 'umi. n. Instrument of ten strings (Hal. 92.3), psaltery (Hal. 81.2). *Lit.*, ten viol.

wi'u. **1.** vi. To smart with pain. **ho'o.wi'u.** To cause to smart. **2.** vs. Dirty, filthy. **ho'o.wi'u.** To besmear, soil. **3.** vs. Entangled, as a kite. **ho'o.wi'u.** To entangle.

wi'u.wi'u. Redup. of *wi'u 1-3*. *Wi'uwi'u loko i ke aloha*, heart painful with love; heart entangled with love.

ho'o.wi'u.wi'u. Redup. of *ho'owi'u*.

wī.wī. **1.** vs. Thin, lean, slender, bony, skinny, rickety, emaciated. See ex., *pīoeoe. Pā wīwī*, rickety, insecure fence. **ho'o.wī.wī.** To make thin, slenderize; to diet in
