wiwini. Same as *winiwini*, sharp.

wiwo. vs. 1. Fearful, bashful, modest, afraid, timid, shy. *Ua hilahila wau, ua wiwo ho'i, ke nānā a'e ko'u mau maka iā'oe, e ku'u Akua* (Ezera 9.6), I am ashamed and blush to lift up my face to thee, my God. (PCP *wiwo*.) 2. Obedient; to mind, obey.

wiwo 'ole. vs. Fearless, brave, bold, courageous, dauntless, intrepid. *Hana wiwo 'ole*, bold or brave deed, adventure. *Mea wiwo 'ole*, intrepid person, adventurer.

wiwo.wiwo. Redup. of *wiwo* 1, 2.

woa. vs. Calm. *Ke kai ko'o me ke kai woa* (chant), the strong sea and the calm sea.

wohi. 1. n. One whose parent was of *pi'o*, *naha*, or *nī'au-pi'o* rank, and the other parent of second degree collaterality. A *wohi* chief was exempt from the prostration taboo (*kapu moe*); he preceded the king on public occasions to see that others prostrated themselves; he was generally a near relative. *'Ai-wohi-kupua* [name], semi-divine *wohi* ruler. Rare, *ohi*, as in the spelling *'Ai-ohi-kupua* (For. 5:411). See saying *kū kahi*. 2. Var. spelling of *ohi* 1, 2.

wolu. 1. Same as *walu*, a fish. *Ka'ū* and *Puna, Hawai'i*.

2. n. Walrus. *Eng.* Also *waleluka*.

wō.wō. vi. To bellow, roar.

Wule.kake, Vulegate. nvs. Vulgate. *Eng.*

wule.kula, vuletura. n. Vulture. *Eng.*
