

Hō.lani. 1. n. Name of a mythical place. Stars observed by priests were *Hōlani-ali'i* and *Hōlani-kū*. 2. Holland; Dutch. *Eng.*

hō.la'o. vi. To pass by, refuse to recognize. *Rare.*

hō.lapa. Same as *ho'olapa*. See *lapa* 1, 2.

hō.lapu. vi. To disturb, roil; to spread, as fire. *Fig.*, to flare, as anger. See saying, *maka'a*. *Ua hōlapu a'e ke ahi ma Alanui Fremont*, the fire spread on Fremont Street.

hole. 1. nvt. To skin, peel, file, rasp, make a groove; to strip, as sugar-cane leaves from the stalk; furrow. Cf. *papa hole*, *pohole*, *puhole*, *penis*. *Hole Wai-mea i ka ihe a ka makani* (name song for Ka-mehameha I, Elbert and Mahoe 52), Wai-mea strips the spear of the wind [the wind refers to warriors, and the song describes their making of spears]. (PNP *sole*; cf. Penrhyn *sosore*, Yasuda 66.) 2. vi. To squirm, twist, turn, fidget; to caress passionately. Cf. *pihole*.

holea. Pas/imp. of *hole* 1, 2. (PEP *solea*.)

hō.lēha. vt. To nibble at food. *Rare.*

hole.hole. 1. Redup. of *hole* 1, 2. *'Ōlelo ka waha, hole-hole ka lima*, the mouth talks, the hand strips [of one who speaks as a friend but does unfriendly deeds]. (PNP *solesole*.) 2. vt. To mix different feathers in a lei; mingling, as feathers. *Rare.*

hole.hole.hia. Pas/imp. of *hole* 1. (For. 5:509.)

hole.hole iwi. v. To strip flesh from the bones, as formerly done with the dead. *Fig.*, to tell evil of one's relatives or reveal confidences.

hō.lēi. 1. n. A small native tree (*Ochrosia compta*) related to the *hao* (*Rauwolfia*) and closely resembling it, but the leaves thicker, the yellow flowers fragrant, and the twinned fruits yellow and much larger. Formerly, bark and roots yielded a yellow dye for tapa. (Neal 691.) 2. nvt. Tapa dyed with *hōlei*; to dye thus. 3. n. An introduced yellow dotted cloth. 4. n. A variety of sweet potato.

hole i'e. v. To groove or carve figures in the *i'e* tapa beater.

hole i'e. v. To strip aerial roots of the *'ie'ie* vine for baskets or plaiting.

hole.lola. n. Holy Roller. *Eng.*

hō.lē'o.lē'o. Same as *ho'ole'ole'o*.

holi. vi. 1. To sprout, as plants or a youth's beard. 2. To ask indirectly, seek to open conversation, search. *'Oi holi mai nei 'o Lei, a noi maoli*, Lei started with indirect hints, then asked directly. (Perhaps PCP (*f,s*)*oli*: Maori *hori*, speak falsely.)

holili. 1. vs. Weak, spindly, puny. (KL line 371.) 2. See *-lili*.

holina. vs. Immature and inferior, as breadfruit falling prematurely.

hō.lina. interj. Haul in! Help! *Eng.*

hō.lio. 1. n. Two species of small, rare, endemic trees (*Cryptocarya*) in the laurel family, found only on Kaua'i and O'ahu. (Neal 361.) 2. vs. Constantly in mind and thought. *Rare.*

hō.li'o. 1. Same as *hōli'oli'o*. 2. (*Cap.*) n. Rain name associated with Hawai'i and O'ahu.

hō.li'o.li'o. Same as *li'oli'o* 1; dazzled, as the eyes by sunlight.

holo. 1. vi. To run, sail, ride, go; to flow, as water; to run, as for political office; to slide, as an avalanche; fleet, fast; double time; landslide; to fare, progress. Cf. *holoholo*, *holo i mua*, *holo lio*, *holomoku*. *Holo nui*, to run fast, gallop. *Holo ka hana*, fast work. *Ua holo ka ulu 'ana o ka pēpē*, the baby is growing fast. *Ka mea e holo ana*, whatever goes; however it goes or happens. *Pehea ka holo 'ana?* How is it going? What fortune? **ho'o.holo.** To sail, run; to cause to run, sail, run free, as a horse; to ride, as a horse; to add water, as to poi; to flush, as a toilet; to drive, as a carriage. *Ho'oholo 'āwīwī*, to speed up, accelerate. *Ho'oholo moa*, to slide the *moa* dart. *Ho'oholo kāmelo* (1 Sam. 30.17), to ride camels. *Ho'oholo i ka wai o ka lua*, to flush the toilet. (PPN *solō*.) 2. vs. Decided, determined, agreed upon, settled, approved, passed, enacted. *Ua holo kō kāua*

mana'o, we have agreed. *Ua holo ke kumu kū'ai*, the price is agreed upon. **ho'o.holo.** To decide, determine, enact, pass, resolve, enforce, appraise, settle, conclude; to manage, as a business; decision, judgment. Cf. *'ōlelo ho'oholo*. *E ho'oholo 'ia*, be it resolved. *Ka ho'oholo kū'oko'a*, independent judgment. *Kōkua 'ia a ho'oholo 'ia*, seconded and carried. *E ho'oholo 'ia e ka Mō'i*, be it enacted by the King. *Ho'oholo i ke kāmā-wai*, enforce the law. *Ho'oholo hou 'ana i ka waiwai*, reappraisal of property. *Ho'oholo 'ia ka 'ōlelo ho'opa'i no ka hewa*, convicted of an offense. 3. n. Noose. 4. n. Running hula step to the side; similar to *kāholo* except that the feet are not necessarily brought together. 5. n. A long bundle, as of hard poi. 6. vt. To sew, as a break in a gourd calabash. See *holoholo* 2, and *kāholo* 2. (PPN *solosolo*.) 7. n. Holes in edge of a canoe, through which lashings were passed to hold a canoe cover in place. (Malo 135.) 8. n. Diagonal pole or strut attached to the inner side of the roof framework and extending obliquely from the upper end of a rafter at one corner to the lower end of the rafter at the other corner. 9. n. Loss of a pebble in the *kōnane* game. (For. 4:57.) 10. n. Hall. *Eng.*

-holo. **ho'o.holo.** Grooved piece above the door frame, in which the door slides.

holoa. Pas/imp. of *holo* 1, 2.

holo.a'a. Var. spelling of *holowa'a*.

holo 'ā. 'ā. See *'ā'ā* 3.

holo ahi. vs. Steam-driven.

holo 'ai. n. Food bundle, especially ti-leaf bundle of hard poi. Cf. *pa'i 'ai*, *pūkele'ai*.

holo.ā.i'a. nvt. To swim like a fish; to get the bends; to drown, sink; the bends, caisson disease. (Gram. 8.7.2.) *Inu 'oe ā holoāi'a* (Kel. 138), drink until [you] swim like [a] fish. **ho'o.holo.ā.i'a.** Caus/sim. *'O ke 'ano e ho'oholoāi'a 'ia ai ka moku kaua, mamuli ia o kona ho'opahū 'ia ana a'e*, the way the warship was sunk, because of being bombed.

holo.'anai. vi. To gallop.

holo.ā.wai. vi. To flow like water. See *limu holoāwai*, Gram. 8.7.2.

holo.hau. vi. To ice skate, ski. *Lit.*, ice run. *Kinipōpō holohau*, ice hockey.

holo hele. vi. To run to and fro; bustle.

holo.hi'a. vi. To dart this way and that, as children at play; to veer at an angle, miss. *Ho'okūkū, ho'onā-nā, nānā kō maka i ka mahina, holohi'a aku, holohi'a mai, nui nō 'oe, nui kō kino* (child's game chant), stand about, look about, let your eyes see the moon, run this way, run that way, you are big, big your body.

holo.holo. 1. vi. To go for a walk, ride, or sail; to go out for pleasure, stroll, promenade. *Holoholo wale*, ride anywhere or aimlessly, stray. *He pule holoholo 'ana*, a continuous prayer. *E holoholo ana ma ka mahina 'ai* (Kin. 3.8), walking in the garden. **ho'o.holo.holo.** To take someone out for a drive or excursion; to escort; to help walk, as a child or invalid. *Ho'oholoholo wa'a* (For. 4:161), to sail canoes. (PPN *solosolo*.) 2. nvt. Basting; to baste, sew. **ho'o.holo.holo.** Caus/sim.; to make large running stitches. *Lopi ho'oholoholo*, basting thread. 3. nvt. A net into which fish run (*holoholo*) after being frightened; to fish with this net. 4. nvt. An old Hawaiian game of kicking a ball to which feathers were attached; to play this game.

Holo.holo.'ā. n. Star name (no data). (Kuhelani.)

holo.holo. Redup. of *holoi*. (PPN *solosolo'i*.)

holo.holo ka'a. v. To go for a drive or ride. See song in Elbert and Mahoe 53-4. **ho'o.holo.holo ka'a.** To take someone for a drive or ride.

holo.holo.kake. Redup. of *holokake*; blown, as by wind.

holo.holo.kē. Redup. of *holokē*.

holo.holo lio. Redup. of *holo lio*; to go horseback riding.

holo.holo.moku. Redup. of *holomoku* 1, 2; ocean trip, cruise.
